Step 1 - Reaching Aarhus

If you arrive by train, check out dsb.dk and GoCollective.dk to find departures. Your train stop will be Aarhus H, located in central Aarhus. If opting for a bus, midttrafik.dk will show you the regional routes.

If you travel by plane, you have three options: Aarhus Airport is the closest to Aarhus, but it is small and has limited connections. The transportation time to the city center is approximately 45 minutes by bus. Billund Airport is larger and offers more connections. The transportation time to the city center by bus is approximately one and a half hours. Copenhagen Airport has numerous connections. From there, you can continue to Aarhus via domestic flights or train. The flight time to Aarhus Airport is 40 minutes, but traveling by train is often more convenient. The direct train ride to Aarhus takes about three and a half hours.

If you are driving, free parking spaces are available in the streets around the department or at the nearby shopping mall Storcenter Nord.

Step 2 - From the city center to the Department of Computer Science

When you arrive in Aarhus, it's time to head to your final destination: **Department of Computer Science, Åbogade 34, 8200 Aarhus N.**

Aarhus is a highly walkable city, and walking to the department from the city center takes around 40 minutes. Alternatively, you can catch one of the many city buses.

The apps "Rejseplanen" and "Midttrafik" can help you find relevant buses. Bus 2A runs regularly and is often the best choice. Get off at "P.-Müllers Vej/Ringgaden", and walk the rest of the way.

Tickets: If you don't have the electronic ticketing card "Rejsekort," you'll need to buy your bus tickets using the "Midttrafik" app.

Step 3 - Finding the right building and room

When you arrive, you just need to find the correct entry, building, and room.

Below is a map of the department showing all buildings and relevant entries. Some doors can only be accessed with a code and key card (marked in red), while others are open to everyone from 8:00 to 15:30 (marked in green). Outside of these hours, all doors require an access card.

All buildings have both a name and a number. For example, the Ada building is also called 5342. Once you are in the correct building, the first digit of the room number indicates the floor where the room is located.

If you need further assistance, you are always welcome to visit the information office in Ada-116.
