01 Reaching Aarhus



Arrival by plane

Aarhus Airport is the closest to Aarhus, but it is small and has limited connections. Bus 925X drives between the airport and Aarhus (approx. 45 min trip). This line also has a stop at Aarhus University before the end station in the city centre.

Billund Airport is larger and offers more connections. Bus 912X drives between the airport and the Aarhus city centre (approx. 1h30m trip)

Copenhagen Airport has numerous connections. From there, you can continue to Aarhus via domestic flights or train. The flight time to Aarhus Airport is 40 minutes, but traveling by train is often more convenient. The direct train ride to Aarhus takes about three and a half hours.

Arrival by train

Check out dsb.dk to find departures. Your train stop will be Aarhus H, located in Aarhus city centre.

Arrival by car

If you are driving, free parking spaces are available in the streets around the department. The nearby shopping mall Storcenter Nord has free parking for up to 4 hours, remember to set your parking disc.

When you arrive in Aarhus, it's time to head to your final destination: **Department of Computer Science, Åbogade 34, 8200 Aarhus N.**

Aarhus is a highly walkable city, and walking to the department from the city centre takes around 40 minutes. Alternatively, you can catch one of the many city buses or the light rail. Apps like **Rejseplanen** and **Google Maps** can help you find relevant public transport.

Bus 2A runs regularly and is often the best choice. Get off at **Storcenter Nord/Paludan Müllers Vej**, and walk the rest of the way.

Tickets:

In the app **RejseBillet** you can buy tickets for all forms of public transport in Denmark. It is available in both Danish and English.

*(If you're staying in Denmark long term, you can also get the electronic ticketing card **Rejsekort**)*

03 Finding the right building and room

Building:
NAME & NUMBER



Example: ADA (5342-116)


Means: Ada building 5342, first floor, room 16.

When you arrive at the department, all that is left to do is find the correct entry, building, and room.

All buildings have both a name and a number. Once you are in the correct building, the first digit of the room number indicates the floor where the room is located.

Below is a map of the department showing all buildings with names, numbers and relevant entries. Some doors can only be accessed with a code and key card (marked in red), while others are open to everyone from 8:00 to 15:30 (marked in green). Outside of these hours, all doors require a key card.
